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Fresh Start Overnight Emergency Warming Center By Howard Martinson, Executive Director howard.martinson@gmail.com, 208-661-1524

For the fifth consecutive winter, Fresh Start will operate Coeur d'Alene's only emergency overnight warming center. When the temperature is expected to drop to 25 degrees lower, Fresh Start opens at 7 p.m. and remains open until 12 Noon the following day.

We do this for several important reasons. First, we aim to alleviate human suffering. Next is public safety – our homeless neighbors have an alternative to starting fires in their tents or sleeping in dumpsters, perhaps suffering from frostbite or other injuries from exposure to the cold. Finally, we leave no stone unturned in our work to avoid preventable deaths.

What's new for the upcoming winter? We've raised our trigger point to open the warming center from 20 degrees to 25 degrees. Under the watchful eyes of Warming Center Director Jeff Short, we expect to open 63 nights this winter, more than double the nights we were open at 20 degrees. The homeless will be able to come to a warm & safe venue. We provide hot food and coffee, showers, warm clothing, laundry and other services. We also offer sleeping mats, blankets and sleeping bags to make the night as comfortable as possible. We insist that our guests behave appropriately. Lights out is at 10 p.m., and everyone is up at 6 a.m. to help clean up and prepare for the day shift.

How can you help with the warming center? Hot food, coffee, new or gently used sleeping bags and warm clothing are always needed. Our expenses for utilities, supplies and staffing increase in the winter. We've budgeted \$150.00 per night to keep the warming center open. Please consider helping out with food, clothing, supplies or by sponsoring a night with your tax-deductible donation of \$150. You'll feel good about your donation, and our homeless neighbors will be safe & comfortable.

Finance at Fresh Start By Lynn Tarbox

Fresh Start has been very fortunate to have weathered the recent recession in fairly good financial shape, primarily because of the wonderful support provided by our many generous donors.

We have seen the numbers of our 'clients' increase substantially each year and we have been able to continue accommodating anyone who comes to us in need.

We have two part-time employees throughout the year, excluding our Warming Center operation (more about that later) and all other labor and supervision comes from volunteers. All of our clothing and most of our food is donated.

All money we receive goes directly to support our operations. Rent, utilities, telephones, computers, and supplies take up most of our income. As we have stated before, we receive no monies from Local, State or Federal entities—it all comes from individual donors and a few grants.

Fresh Start has a budget of approximately \$7,500 per month, and we carry no debt.

We have experienced a reduced level of donations this year and our expenses have slightly increased, which is of concern to us as winter approaches.

Our Board of Directors has made the decision to open the Warming Center at night when the temperature is 25° or lower. As you will read elsewhere in the Newsletter, this decision, as well as other factors, will cause us to be open twice the number of nights as last year and we expect substantially more than double the number of people than we saw last winter. This will require us to hire help, in addition to volunteers that we hope to have, and should increase our expenses about \$2,000 per month during the winter.

With the above in mind, we really and truly need your financial support more than ever before. We are certainly aware that you are being inundated with requests for financial support at this time of year. It is our hope that you favorably consider the needs of the homeless in our community and send a check to Fresh Start in the enclosed envelope.

Thanks for your support and let's all hope for a warmer winter.
